A lot of knowledge has been lost in the centuries since European invaders destroyed these cultures. Even so, historians were able to piece


together their civilizations and here we are with knowledge of their food!

Every year at NordicFuzzCon, I look forward to the Strut Your Stuff contest, NFC's answer to Project Runway or America's Next Top Model.


This year's edition was no disappointment. We had 6 contestants, who wowed us all the way up and down the catwalk with their fashion.
