We also managed to convince the chef to share his recipe for the soup served to SOUP.

Chef Stripe's Chipotle Spiced Tomato Soup

Ingredients (2 servings):

1 half large onion (diced)
2 cloves of garlic (crushed)
3 tbsp chipotle powder or (1 crushed whole chipotle)
2 tbsp chipotle paste
300 g tomato passata (Basically pureed chopped tomatoes)
250 ml cream (or vegan cream substitute)
500 ml vegetable stock
15 g freshly chopped parsley

How to

- 1. Start by sweating off the onion and garlic in a touch of olive oil in a pot on medium high heat. Once they've gotten a bit of colour, add the chipotle powder and paste and let it fry with the onion and garlic.
- 2. Add in the vegetable stock and the tomato passata. And stir it in well. Turn the heat to low and let it simmer for 30-45 minutes. Stir it a bit every now and then. Remember to taste, and add salt and pepper as you see fit.
- **3.** Once it's simmered enough for your taste, add in the cream and the chopped parsley, and it's ready to serve! (Jacy)


